The Location:

The Lizard Peninsula is situated on the most southerly tip of Cornwall. Due to its unique geology and mild climate it is home to a wide range of wild flowers, many only found in this area.

This course is based in Coverack and will explore the flora of the surrounding area including: Black Head, Predannack, Kynance, and Goonhilly Downs.



The Course includes:-

Three guided walks, two half days and one full day spent observing and identifying the diversity of the flora in several coastal regions. Evenings will include a workshop on plant identification and a talk by a well known botanist.

Lunch will be provided on the Saturday and the Sunday.

Numbers have been restricted to 12 allowing much individual time.

Course leaders:

The course is to be led by local botanist Dr Gillian Ashworth. Gillian spent several years working at Kew Gardens before moving to the USA as a Professor of Botany at Boston University. She has now returned to live in Coverack and has a great interest and enthusiasm for the local flora.

Peter Wood is a local plant enthusiast and naturalist. For many years a teacher he has extensive knowledge of the area.



Itinerary

Friday 25th May Registration Meet between 12 and 1pm at The Fisherman's Rest, by the harbour, in Coverack 1pm. Set off from Dolor Point, to Treleaver Farm by car and then walk towards Black Head with the option of walking back to Coverack along the coastal path.

7pm Coverack School. An evening of introductory talks, and demonstrations on the identification of plants and plant families. Tea and coffee available.

Saturday 26th May 9am Meet at National Trust Predannack Wollas Car Park. This will be an all day expedition to Predannack and Kynance. A pasty lunch will be provided, please bring your own drink.

7pm Coverack School a talk given by an invited botanist. Tea & coffee available.

Sunday 27th May 9am A walk on Goonhilly Downs, ending with a farewell lunch at Roskilly's Croust House, Tregellast Barton.
